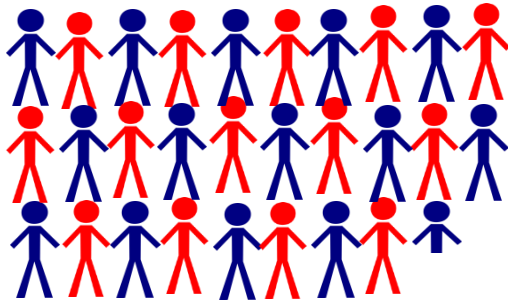

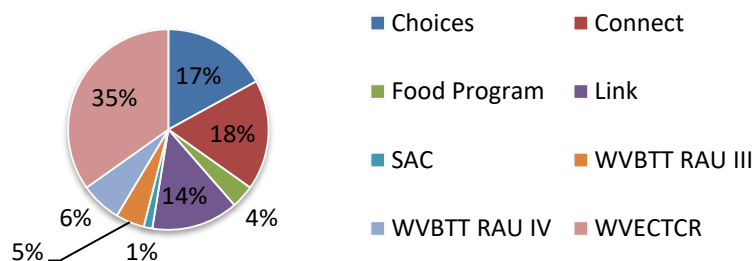

Key: 1 person = 1000 people served

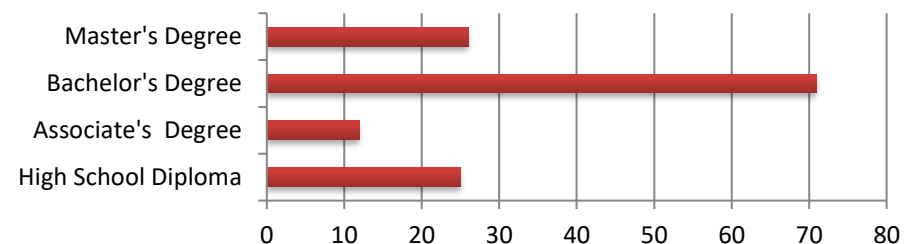


## Yearly Budget
