All About WV Birth to Three

WV Birth to Three is a statewide system of resources and supports for children under age three who have a delay in their development, or may be at risk of having a delay, and their family. The Department of Health and Human Resources, through the Bureau for Public Health and the Office of Maternal, Child and Family Health, WV Birth to Three, as the lead agency for Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), assures that family centered, community based services are available to all eligible children and families. These services are funded in part by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part C, through the U.S. Department of Education and the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources (the state's lead agency responsible for implementation), Bureau for Public Health, Office of Maternal, Child and Family Health, in cooperation with the West Virginia Early Intervention Interagency Coordinating Council.

Who is eligible?

An infant or toddler under the age of three can either have a delay in one or more areas of their development, or be at risk of possibly having delays in the future. A child may have delays in one or more of the following areas:

Cognitive - thinking and learning

Physical - moving, seeing and hearing

Social/emotional - feeling, coping, getting along with others

Adaptive - doing things for him/herself

Communication - understanding and communicating with others

A child may have risk factors such as:

A condition which is typically associated with a developmental delay such as Down Syndrome; or

A combination of biological and other risk factors. Some of these factors may include family stressors.

How do I make a referral?

To refer a child to the WV Birth to Three system in-state, complete the WVBTT Referral Form and forward to the office that services the child's location. You may also call 1-866-321-4728

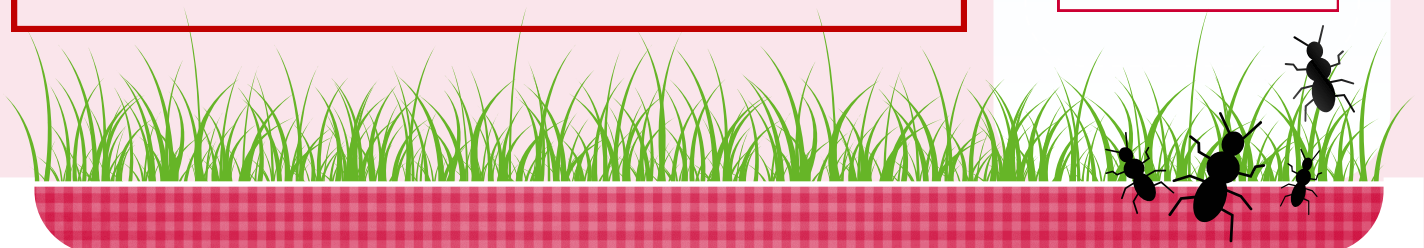

A Parent's Story



When our daughter was 17 months old she was not yet walking or standing independently and had very few words. Our pediatrician recommended that we contact the Birth to 3 program. Within a day we had our first meeting set-up. We were immediately impressed by how accommodating and flexible the therapists and care coordinators were. They met us at our offices, Starbucks, daycare, and home. Throughout our time in the program, each therapist has cared for our daughter like she was their own.

After being fitted with insoles, and a few months of physical therapy, our daughter started walking independently and has been on the go ever since. It is such a thrill to see her run down the hall after her big brother, and to hear her giggle as she attempts to bounce on the trampoline or walk on the balance beam at gymnastics. Her faces lights up with a grin every time she accomplishes something new.

Her communication and receptive language skills have also increased tremendously over the last six months. She now uses several signs and responds quickly when she is given a task to complete. She points to things that interest her and loves sharing her favorite pictures in her books. She engages in elaborate pretend play and interacts well with her peers.

Each of her therapists – physical, developmental, and speech – arrive at our home each appointment with new ideas to try out with her. They readily adapt the activities to meet her interests, and give us innovative suggestions to try out with her at home. They have helped us tackle her fears. When she became afraid of the bath, our therapist suggested putting her in a laundry basket in the tub, and it worked like a charm. When one therapist noticed her interest in dogs, she brought us a little book with dogs and activities to go with it. Our physical therapist suggested gymnastics, and our daughter loves somersaulting and playing around at the gym.

We have told so many people that Birth to Three is one the most amazing programs that West Virginia has to offer. We are so grateful for Birth to Three and the dedication of everyone in the program. We look forward to continue watching our daughter make strides as she completes her last year in the program.

- Information on community resources that will personally benefit each family

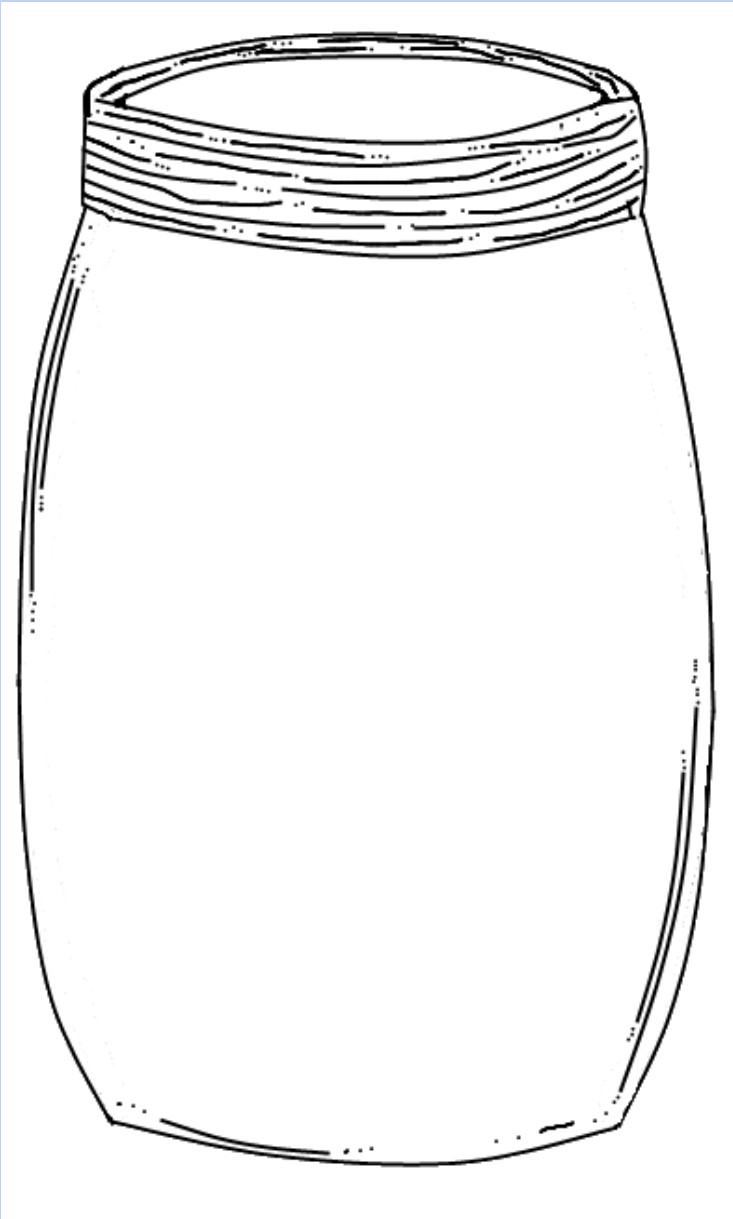

My name is Amber Huffman and I am the Parent Partner for RAU III. I am going to share a little bit about me as I have been in your shoes with the WV Birth to Three system. I am a foster/adoptive parent and I have many experiences with River Valley Child Development Services. Within two years, our family gained eight little feet. Through our two years of fostering, I have developed into a different person. While many of my children went through Birth to Three, one of my children was severely delayed in most areas. She is currently still in the program, we have weekly coaching visits with various team members. The most important advice that I could give to any parent is to never give up on a child. Everybody has their rough days, but for a child that is developmentally delayed it means so much more. I look at how strong my kids have been and all that they have gone through, and for them to continue life smiling is such a blessing to me. Every child and their past is unique, but when you build the foundation for their future it will show what they are capable of. Could we have done it on our own? No. But we have had such a great support system in our journey and that is vitally important. With many services including occupational therapists, physical therapists, nutritionists, developmental specialists, speech therapists, and so much more, we have more than benefited from the WV Birth to Three system. Children develop at their own pace and sometimes need a little assistance taking the next step. In closing, I wish all WV Birth to Three parents strength and continuous love in their beautiful journey of WV Birth to Three. It is great to be a part of.
